Step 1: What did the text mean to the biblical audience?

- a. Read seriously and observe the text. What does the text say?
 - i. Words, Phrases, and Sentences
 - ii. Sentences, Paragraphs, Chapters, and Episodes
- b. Break the passage into manageable parts.

1) Find the Beginning and End of the Passage

- 1 Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, To those who are elect exiles of the dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia,
- 2 according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in the sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience to Jesus Christ and for sprinkling with his blood: May grace and peace be multiplied to you.
- 3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,
- 4 to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you,
