How to Read and Study Your Bible Lesson 9 – November 6, 2011

Step 1: What did the text mean to the biblical audience?

- a. Read seriously and observe the text. What does the text say?
- b. Break the passage into manageable parts.
- c. Determine the context of the passage.
 - 1) Historical-Cultural Context
 - a) Biblical author
 - b) Biblical audience
 - c) Other elements: geography, social customs, religion, economy, politics, etc.
 - 2) Literary Context
 - a) Genre, Form
 - b) Surrounding context

How to Identify the Surrounding Context?

- 1) Identify how the book is divided into paragraphs or sections phrasing.
- 2) Summarize the main idea of each section in about a dozen words or less.
 - a. The topic or main idea of the section what are we talking about?
 - b. What the author says about the topic or main idea what are we saying about what we're talking about?
- 3) Explain how the section you are studying relates to the surrounding sections.
